Reporting to the Course Director the Senior Lecturer will:

- Serve as Year 3 or Year 4 Unit Chair, in both a leadership and operational capacity, working closely with and supported by the Course Director and Deputy Directors; Assessment Lead; Clinical School Directors; Theme and Rotation/Topic Leads; and Curriculum and Student Experience (CaSE) Team to deliver an outstanding student experience in Years 3 and 4 of the Deakin Doctor of Medicine Course.
- · Serve as first point of contact for students within a unit (regarding academic and progression advice, and student welfare concerns)
- Lead unit and rotation teaching teams and work collaboratively with other teaching and professional teams in the MD course to develop effective unit curricula and learning materials (including the development and curation of online resources in CloudDeakin). Lead review of units and implement refinements.
- · Integrate Australian Medical Council (AMC) accreditation requirements and Medical Deans Australia and New Zealand (MDANZ) frameworks, clinical and/or research practice into unit design to improve student learning experiences, success, engagement and resources.
- Design collaborative learning opportunities for MD students, in collaboration with rotation convenors and topic leads at the Clinical Schools. Support diverse learners by designing accessible and inclusive unit and course material, assessment tasks and practices.
- · Manage the online learning management system (CloudDeakin) for Years 3 and 4 of the MD course, overseeing content and responding to student discussion posts.
- Collaborate with the MD Year 3 and 4 teaching and assessment teams, School and Faculty staff to implement University governance procedures and maintain academic standards
- · Foster a culture of collaboration and educational excellence within the MD course. Build teaching and learning capability and effective unit teaching teams related to clinical disciplines and support the professional development of other academics (including clinical teaching staff at the Clinical Schools).
