Position Summary

The School of Psychological Sciences at the University of Tasmania is growing the mental health work force for Tasmania. The School has embarked on exciting changes to our program, aimed at enhancing training for generalist and clinical psychologists, accessible across the state. We are also working towards introducing the Masters of Psychology (Educational and Developmental). We are searching for an experienced academic Psychologist with clinical and/or educational and developmental endorsement, who will join this journey and help us provide much needed support for the growing demand on the Tasmanian mental health work force.

The University of Tasmania is building a vision of a place-based University with a mission to enhance the intellectual, economic, social and culture future of Tasmania, and from Tasmania, contribute to the world in areas of distinctive advantage. The University recognises that achieving this vision is dependent on the people we employ as well as creating a people-centered University that is values-based, relational, diverse, and development-focused.

The position we are seeking to appoint is an Associate Professor Post Graduate Psychology, a leadership position in the <u>School of Psychological Sciences</u>, which is part of <u>the College of Health and Medicine</u>. The School of Psychological Sciences is home to world class research in psychology and offers undergraduate and postgraduate degrees in psychological sciences, clinical and professional psychology and counselling. Our teaching is multi-campus, delivering content in Hobart, Launceston, the Cradle Coast, and online.

This balanced teaching and research position will make a significant contribution to leadership in the School. In learning and teaching. The appointee will have a significant role in the development and implementation of our new curricula in the postgraduate program which aligns with both the 2019 Australian Psychology Accreditation Council (APAC) standards and the University of Tasmania postgraduate course structures. They would be expected to contribute to curriculum development, teaching and clinical supervision in a range of Clinical and/or Educational and Developmental topics at postgraduate level, including Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT), professional ethics, psychological assessment, and psychopathology. The appointee will be expected to contribute to face-to-face, blended and online delivery of teaching.

As this is a leadership role, the successful applicant will also have a strong research record and will grow the research capacity of our School. The appointee's research interests will be aligned with the College of Health and Medicine's research themes that include brain science and mental health. The strong research culture of the School includes strengths in cognitive neuroscience, applied cognition, developmental and clinical psychology. A new initiative in the School is a collaboration with the Department of Health that has established a new Centre for Mental Health Service Innovation, and the successful applicant would be expected to contribute towards leading the growth in research activities and development of the center.

- Contribute to the supervision of provisional psychologists as they undertake their placements in the University Psychology Clinic, or external placements as required. Supervision would include supervising therapy and/or assessment sessions.

- Current Psychology Board of Australia Approved Supervisor Status, with approval to supervise provisional psychologists during an accredited higher degree program
- Extensive experience and demonstrated achievement in University-level teaching and learning including Postgraduate Psychology.
- Extensive experience in developing and implementing scholarly and innovative approaches to teaching and learning, including blended and online educational approaches
- Knowledge of, and ability to apply, Australian Psychology Accreditation Council (APAC) accreditation standards to curriculum development and implementation
- A substantial record of successful research higher degree student supervision and completions.
- A substantial record in, and continuing commitment to, research that has achieved international
 recognition and made innovative, and sustained contributions to the field of Clinical and or
 Educational and Developmental psychology, demonstrated by a very strong record of high-quality
 publications, presentations at conferences and success in securing external competitive and other
 funding.
- Proven ability as an academic leader, with a record in team building and creating effective working relationships, and capacity to foster excellence in research and teaching.
